Let's stop inviting Satan to discourages us

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(Romans 3:20)

When we get over into the kingdom of God, we will not look to the best deeds that we have done, and thank God that we are justified because we have done so well. But our song of joy will be, "To Him who loved us and washed us from our sins in His own blood." (Revelation 1:5) And so we know that when we yield ourselves to Him and die to self constantly, He does these things for us that we cannot do for ourselves. Let us look to Him continually!
